ADMISSION TERMS AND CONDITIONS

ELIGIBILITY FOR B.Sc. NURSING

1. The minimum age for admission shall be 17 years on 31st December of the year in which admission is sought. The maximum age limit for admission shall be 35 years.
2. Minimum Educational Qualification
 - a) Candidate with Science who has passed the qualifying 12th Standard examination (10+2) and must have obtained a minimum of 45% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology taken together and passed in English individually.
 - b) Candidates are also eligible from State Open School recognized by State Government and National Institute of Open School (NIOS) recognized by Central Government having Science subjects and English only.
 - c) English is a compulsory subject in 10+2 for being eligible for admission to B.Sc. (Nursing).
3. Color blind candidates are eligible if color corrective contact lens and spectacles are worn by such candidates.
4. Candidate shall be medically fit.
5. Married candidates are also eligible for admission
6. Students shall be admitted once in a year.
7. Selection of candidates is based on the merit of the entrance examination (PNST). Entrance test is conducted by State Nursing Council.
8. Reservation Policy: Admission under the reserved quota is subject to reservation policy and eligibility criteria for SC/ST/OBC/EWSs prescribed by the State Govt.
9. Foreign Nationals: The entry qualification equivalency i.e., 12th standard will be obtained by Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi. Institution, SNRC and University will be responsible to ensure that the qualification and eligibility will be equivalent to what has been prescribed by the Council.
10. Admission/Selection Committee This committee comprises of:
 - Principal (Chairperson)
 - Vice Principal
 - Professor
 - Chief Nursing officer or nursing superintendent
11. Admission Strength. No of seats: - 50 (B.Sc. Nursing)
12. Health Services: There is a provision for the following health services for the students. (An annual medical examination)
 - Vaccination against Tetanus, Hepatitis B or any other communicable disease as considered necessary
 - Free medical consultancy during illness

- A complete health record is kept in respect of each individual student. The criteria for continuing the training of a student with long term chronic illness, will be decided by the College

ADMISSION NORMS FOR B.Sc. NURSING

1. The admission for B.Sc. nursing course is only through an entrance examination (PNST- Pre Nursing Selection Test) conducted by the Madhya Pradesh Employees Selection Board and as per their norms mentioned by MPNRC.
2. The registered candidate has report to the institution with the institutional allotment order.
3. The admission committee of the educational institution will examine the information and original documents (mentioned in page no. 25) of eligible candidates issued online through the portal.
4. The candidate has to deposit the institutional fees, original documents, and photocopies of documents to confirm the admission in the institute.
5. If the candidate cancels the admission during the training, it is compulsory to deposit the remaining amount of training fees to the institution. (Madhya Pradesh Rajpatra dated 24/12/2024 page no. 716 (31) rule no. 12(C).
6. If any documents submitted are found to be fake or the candidate violates the rules and regulations of the institute the institute, may terminate/cancel the admission of the candidate.

ELIGIBILITY FOR M.Sc. NURSING

- The candidate should be a registered nurse and registered midwife or equivalent with any state nursing registration council.
- The minimum education requirements shall be the passing of: B.Sc. Nursing / B.Sc. Hons. Nursing / Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing with minimum of 55% aggregate marks.
- The candidate should have undergone in B.Sc. Nursing / B.Sc. Hons. Nursing / Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing in an institution that is recognized by the Indian Nursing Council.
- Minimum one year of work experience after Basic B.Sc. Nursing.
- Minimum one year of work experience prior to or after Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing.
- The Candidate shall be medically fit.

SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION FORMS (M.Sc. Nursing)

The application on prescribed form should be submitted to the Principal, Bombay Hospital College of Nursing, Indore, before the last date along with the following enclosures:

- Filled in application form
- Passport size attested photographs (3) and attested photocopies of 10th, 12th, four year B.Sc. Nursing degree mark sheets, degree, registration & experience certificate.

- At the time of the interview all original mark sheets will be required.
- If SC/ST/OBC, attach attested certificates of the same.
- Medical fitness certificate from authorized Govt. medical officer.

Students will be required to pay described fees as per the State Government Norms.

FACILITIES

1. PHYSICAL FACILITIES:

Location: Bombay Hospital College of Nursing, Indore, is located 7 kilometers from the railway station and bus stand and 6 kilometers from M.Y Hospital and M.G.M. Medical College, on the 6th floor of Bombay Hospital, Indore. M.P.

Campus: Bushy green lawns surround the whole complex with ample area for future expansion.

Other facilities: Also bank i.e. ICICI, ATM facility, separate cafeteria, and other facilities available at our premises for students' convenience.

2. TEACHING AND LEARNING FACILITIES:

Teaching Faculty: The college of Nursing has highly qualified and experienced nursing faculty as per I.N.C norms along with guest lecturers. Regular in-service education is provided, and the faculty is sponsored for state and national seminars and workshops. The latest teaching pedagogies are used with student - centric approach. Students learn various courses under the elective module, LMS and as per NEP policy.

Lecture Halls: The College of Nursing has got 6 lecture halls with the latest equipment of A.V. aids for teaching purposes such as smart boards, over head projectors, and L.C.D projectors.

Laboratory: The College of Nursing has well - equipped laboratories for Advanced Health Nursing, Foundation of Nursing, Community Health Nursing, Anatomy and Physiology, O.B.G, Pediatric, Nutrition, Microbiology, Biochemistry, and Pathology. Beside this, the institute has a good number of audio-visual aids in various subjects.

Library: Fully automated library with e-learning facilities, DELNET. The library also contributes all leading national and international journals. Book bank facility i.e. free book distribution for advanced learners and economically weaker students, hostel library available.

Auditorium: The institute has sufficient facilities to organize seminars, conferences, and workshops.

Computer Lab: Keeping pace with the latest technology, we have a fully equipped computer lab with Internet facilities.

3. CLINICAL FACILITIES:

Bombay Hospital College of Nursing has its own multispecialty parent hospital. For wider clinical exposure to various disciplines, the college has affiliations with Metro Pediatric Hospital, PC Sethi Civil Hospital, and Govt Mental Hospital. Students are also posted in Bombay Hospital, Mumbai, as a part of the Vacation Intern Program.

4. FIELD PRACTICE:

For community nursing the college has an affiliation with the Urban and Rural Public Health , including adopted village.

5. MEDICAL FACILITIES:

Periodic medical checkup, consultation, diagnostic facility and treatments will be available to all the students in case of sickness as per the hospital policy. As per the prevailing schedule, immunization against infectious disease (Hepatitis B) will be done regularly for all the students.

6. HOSTEL FACILITIES:

The Nursing College Hostel has rooms with attached latrine and bathroom. A recreation hall with adequate facilities like TV, and indoor games is also available. There is provision of a fridge, geyser, water cooler, and induction cooker in the hostel for the students.

7. SPORTS:

The college has its own sports ground with adequate facilities for outdoor games. Annual cultural and sports meets are held.

8. TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES:

Transport facilities for the students are available from the college.

9. VARIOUS CELLS, COMMITTEES, UNITS FOR STUDENTS' WELFARE:

The college has an IQAC, examination cell, innovation cell, anti Ragging cell, grievances redressal cell, internal complaint committee, language lab, foreign language training, scholarship, yoga club, eco green club, and 100% placement in Bombay Hospital, Also Bank i.e. ICICI, ATM facility, separate cafeteria, and other facilities available at our premises for student's convenience.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Every student admitted to the B.Sc. Course shall follow the rules and regulations of the Nursing College as existing at present, and as may be modified from time to time.
- Every student will have to attend classes and practical work regularly as per the I.N.C. and university requirements.
- Student will be under the control of the Principal throughout the period of training.
- A student has to complete 100% attendance in the practical else the mark sheet, degree certificate and course completion certificate will be withheld until the student meets the requirements.
- Students are not allowed to receive reward of any kind at any time from the patients or their relatives.
- All students are expected to follow the dress code at Bombay Hospital College of Nursing.
- Students shall abide by the rules and regulations of the hostel and adhere to the orders of the hostel warden.
- Hostel stay is compulsory for all the students. Parents or guardians of the student may appoint a local guardian if so desired, for their ward. In such a case they need to submit the entire personal data and photograph of the local guardian. If the student is permitted to

go out of the hostel on the request of the local guardian, the entire responsibility would be of the parents who have appointed the local guardian.

- The local guardian can meet their ward only on Sundays. In case of any emergency, prior permission shall be obtained from the warden.
- The students will be allowed to go for shopping as per the college sanctioned days.
- No student shall be provided any extra facilities (electric appliances, almirah, stool, chair etc) in the hostel other than those provided by the institute nor will any such requests be entertained)
- Telephone calls & visitors will not be entertained in the classrooms or in clinical areas
- No jewellery or other valuables should be retained while joining the institution.
- All decisions taken by the authority are final and binding.
- Parents/Guardians are required to meet the principal when called for.
- Ragging is a punishable crime and any student found involved in ragging shall immediately be removed from the institute and handed over to police.

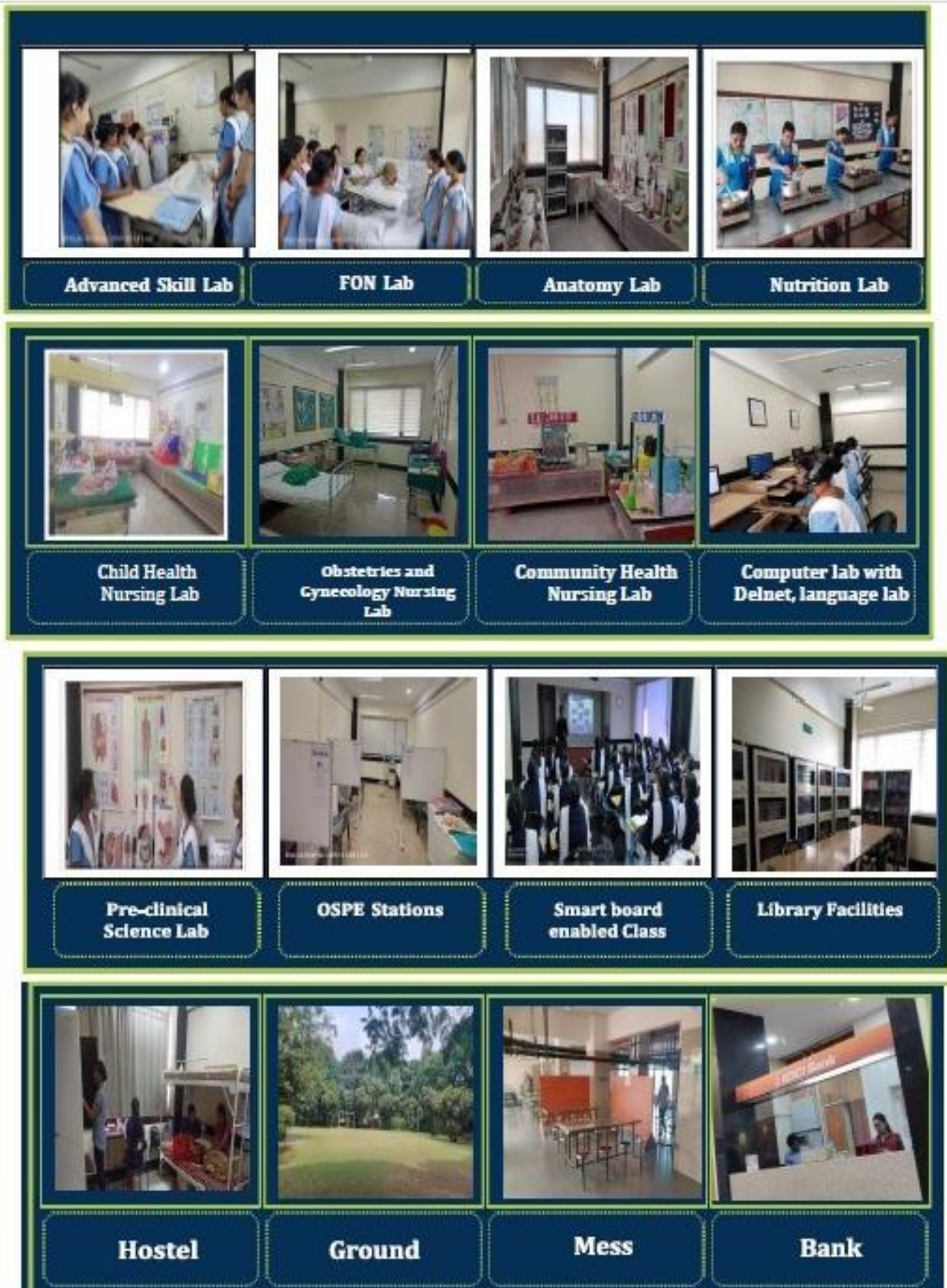
