Nursing Course, which is recognized by the Indian Nursing Council and is affiliated to Madhya Pradesh Medical Science University, Jabalpur. Objectives

- To provide a broad based education for preparation of nursing personnel at tertiary level who can function in a wide variety of settings and to assume responsibilities in preventive, promotive, curative and rehabilitative care of the patients at hospital and community level.

B.Sc. Nursing Course & Its Objectives

The course is intended to prepare graduates to assume responsibilities as professional, competent nurses and midwives in providing promotive, preventive, curative, and rehabilitative services.

The course is of 4 years including internship. Students shall be required to attend a regular course of study. The procedure of examination will be in the form of terminals, half yearly, Pre University followed by final examination conducted by Madhya Pradesh Medical Science University, Jabalpur, every year.

On completion of the four year B.Sc. Nursing course the graduate will be able to: -

- Demonstrate critical thinking skill in making decisions in all situations in order to provide quality care.
- Provide promotive, preventive health policies and programmes.

- Demonstrate leadership and managerial skills in clinical/community health settings.
- Utilize the latest trends and technology in providing health care.
- Communicate effectively with individuals and groups and members of the health team in order to promote effective interpersonal relationship and teamwork.

M.Sc. Nursing Course & Its Objectives

- Demonstrate interest in continued learning for personal and professional advancement.

Admission rules

Eligibility for B.Sc. Nursing

ADMISSION TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. The minimum age for admission shall be 17 years on 31st December of the year in which admission is sought; the maximum age limit for admission shall be 35 years.
2. Minimum educational qualification
 - a) Candidates with science who have passed the qualifying 12th standard examination (10 + 2) and must have obtained a minimum of 45% marks in Physics, chemistry, and biology, taken together and passed in English Individually.
 - b) Candidates are also eligible for State Open School recognized by the state government and National Institute of open school (NIOS) recognized by the Central government. Having science subjects and English only
3. English is a compulsory subject in 10 + 2 for being eligible for admission to B.Sc Nursing.
4. Only female candidates are eligible for admission.
5. Candidates shall be medically fit.

Eligibility for M.Sc. Nursing

- The candidate should be a Registered Nurse and Registered midwife or equivalent with any State Nursing Registration Council.
- The minimum education requirements shall be the passing of: B.Sc. Nursing / B.Sc. Hons. Nursing / Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing with minimum of 55% aggregate marks.
- The candidate should have undergone in B.Sc. Nursing / B.Sc. Hons. Nursing / Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing in an institution which is recognized by Indian Nursing Council.
- Minimum one year of work experience after Basic B.Sc. Nursing.
- Minimum one year of work experience prior or after Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing.
- Candidate shall be medically fit.
- Only female candidate will be allowed.

Basis of Selection

The selection of the candidate to B.Sc. Nursing & M.Sc. Nursing courses will be made on the basis of the merit of qualifying examination and selection test.

Selection test for B.Sc. Nursing

The selection test includes written test and personal interview. The test will be based on senior secondary school certificate (10+2) syllabus of Physics, Chemistry and Biology. The test will also includes questions on English, Comprehension, vocabulary and General Knowledge.

Selection test for M.Sc. Nursing

The selection test includes written test and personal interview. The test will be based on syllabus of B.Sc. Nursing course. The test will also includes questions on English, Comprehension, Vocabulary and General Knowledge.

Selected Candidates

List of the selected candidates will be displayed on the notice board of the college. List of the selected candidates will not be informed by post. Selected candidates will have to undergo Medical Examination at this hospital before joining the course.

Fees

Students will be required to pay fees as per the State Government norms.

- Clinical Training fees to be paid in equal installment during the period of course, which will be refunded on completion of 2yrs clinical training in Bombay hospital from the end of B.Sc. Nursing 4year course.
- The above mentioned fees shall not include examination and enrollment fees of the University
- Students are responsible for cost of books and uniform during the whole training period. A list of required textbooks will be supplied to the candidates.

Facilities

1. Physical facilities:

Location:

Bombay Hospital College of Nursing, Indore is located 7 kilometers from Railway station and Bus stand and 6 kilometers from M.Y Hospital and M.G.M. Medical College.

Campus:

Bushy green lawns surround the whole complex with ample area for future expansion.

2. Teaching facilities:

Teaching Faculty: The college of Nursing has highly qualified and experienced nursing faculty as per I.N.C forms along with guest lecturers. Regular inservice education is provided and the faculty is sponsored for State and National Seminars and workshops

Lecture Halls: - The college of Nursing has got 6 lecture halls with latest equipment of A.V aids for teaching purpose such as slide projectors, over head projectors and L.C.D projectors.

Laboratory: - The College of Nursing has well equipped laboratories for foundation of Nursing, Community Health Nursing, Anatomy and Physiology, O.B.G, M.C.H, Nutrition, Microbiology, Biochemistry and Pathology. Beside this, institute has a good number of Audio visual aids in various subjects.

Library: - Besides the central library of Bombay Hospital College of Nursing Bombay Hospital has its own library containing textbooks, CD's, dissertations and reference books of all disciplines of nursing. The library also contributes all leading National and International Journals.

Auditorium: - Institute has sufficient facilities to organize seminars, conferences and workshops.

Computer Lab: - Keeping pace with latest technology, we have a fully equipped computer lab with Internet facility.

3. Clinical Facilities:

Bombay Hospital College of Nursing has its own multi specialty parent hospital. For wider clinical exposure to various disciplines, the College has affiliation with Dolphin Hospital, Choithram Hospital, District Gynaec Hospital, District Mental hospital. Students are also posted in Bombay Hospital, Mumbai.

Field Practice:

For Community Nursing the college has affiliated with the Urban and Rural Public Health Centers.

4. Medical Facilities: -

Periodic Medical checkup, consultation, Diagnostic facility and treatment will be available to all the students in case of sickness as per the hospital policy.

As per the prevailing schedule, immunization against infectious disease (Hepatitis B, rubella) will be done regularly for all the students.

5. Hostel Facilities: -

The Nursing College Hostel is housed in 7th and 9th floors of Bombay Hospital building, which have rooms with attached latrine and bathroom. Recreation hall with adequate facilities like TV, tape, CD player etc are also available. There is provision of fridge, geyser, water cooler and induction cooker in the hostel for the students.

6. Sports: -

The College has its own sports ground with adequate facilities for indoor and outdoor games. Annual cultural and sports meet are held.

7. Transportation Facilities: -

Transport facilities for the students are available from the college.

8. Other facilities: -

The College has Bank of India's branch, ATM facility, separate cafeteria and other facilities available at our premises for student's convenience.

Rules and Regulations

- Every student admitted to the B.Sc. and M.Sc. Nursing Course shall follow the rules and regulations of the Nursing College as existing at present, and as may be modified from time to time.
- Every student will have to attend classes and practical work regularly as per the I.N.C. and university requirements.
- Student will be under the control of the Principal throughout the period of training.
- A student has to complete 100% attendance in the practical else the mark sheet, degree certificate and course completion certificate will be withheld until the student meets the requirements.
- Students are not allowed to receive reward of any kind at any time from the patients or their relatives.
- All students are expected to follow the dress code at Bombay Hospital College of Nursing.
- Students shall abide by the rules and regulations of the hostel and adhere to the orders of the hostel warden.
- Hostel stay is compulsory for all the students except M.Sc Nursing students. Parents or guardians of the student may appoint a local guardian if so desired, for their ward. In such a case they need to submit the entire personal data and photograph of the local guardian. If the student is permitted to go out of the hostel on the request of the local guardian, the entire responsibility would be of the parents who have appointed the local guardian.
- The local guardian can meet their ward only on Sundays. In case of any emergency, prior permission shall be obtained from the warden.
- The students will be allowed to go for shopping as per the college sanctioned days.
- No student shall be provided any extra facilities (electric appliances, almirah, stool, chair etc) in the hostel other than those provided by the institute nor will any such requests be entertained

- Telephone calls & visitors will not be entertained in the classrooms or in clinical areas
- No jewellery or other valuables should be retained while joining the institution.
- All decisions taken by the authority are final and binding.
- Parents/Guardians are required to meet the Principal when called for.
- Ragging is a punishable crime and any student found involved in ragging shall immediately be removed from the institute and handed over to police.
